I, currently homeless, 45 year old mother of two young children, that sought shelter

<u>after leaving a domestic violence situation.</u>

<u>I have a history of 23 years as a Sonoma County Paramedic, County Preceptor, Field Training</u>
Officer, and a Relief Supervisor.

In addition, I was employed as joint faculty at the Santa Rosa Junior College, teaching evaluating, and mentoring Paramedic students, for 10+ years.

I was humbly chosen to be 1 of 3 Paramedics, after extensive interviews for the Quick Response Vehicle (QRV) out of over 30 applicants.

I, ignorantly thought it would be a somewhat easy task to rehouse myself and my two daughters. Having to re-evaluate my situation, realizing the difficulty of my situation, I threw myself into networking, utilizing the advocates and professionals I met along the way, as well as my own tireless research, tenacity, and grit, am finally making strides. Thus regaining hope, encouragement, and a second wind.

I have formed many incredible, compassionate, educated, professionals, that have had invaluable advice and support, directly related to Homelessness.

Problems / Barrier

Chronic homeless is an epidemic in our county, as we see on a daily basis.

<u>Unfortunately, a very small margin of homeless, with all the tenacity of successfully finding permanent housing will fail.</u>

<u>Facing nearly impossible odds, there are multiple missing links to the many, many homeless...</u> that thrive to have permanent housing.

No fault of their own, most have fallen through the cracks.

<u>Elderly, non- computer literate, language barrier, no transportation, mental illness, addictions, leaves many feeling helpless.</u> Helplessness leads to Hopeless.

It becomes so overwhelming, like deciding what to eat for the rest of your life, versus, what's for dinner tonight.

3.) Solutions:

Breaking tasks into small tangible goals, briggs hope, and more importantly, momentum, to continue in a forward and closer goal of permanent housing. Also, encourages, and motivates others, to follow in their footsteps.

Solution:

Through the trenches, I have been blessed to find so many short cuts through this muddled system, and find hope, and results. I have developed a passion at helping people in my similar situation find hope, small changes forward, and would be honored to be of help..

Here are a few tidbits I have found that were invaluable...

- A) Sonoma County Library has chrome books for free check out.
- B) In addition, free portable WiFi, for check out.
- C) Non profit food organizations that will deliver food to wherever you are, home cooked, even in a creek..
- D) voucher for ID card. (invaluable!)
- E.) New free phones(better then stand-up) that will deliver to wherever you are!
- F.) Vouchers for application fees for applying for housing..
- (\$25 a place 4= \$100!)
- G.) How to apply for a free donated car (sober and clean a must) to anyone in need.
- H.) Free bus passes
- I.) Non-profit organizations that will fill out disability, food stamps, etc, especially to our language barrier and elderly.

That is just to name a few, and through trial and error, taking one thing, example ID, and setting a goal of a week, is tangible, not so overwhelming that you just give up...it causes a feeling of accomplishment. Which in turn leads to the next step and so on.

I know with the current COVID it has been hectic and I would love to, at an opportune time, sit down and borrow a little of your time to see if I could be of assistance..

I once had compassion, now I have empathy...
