Dear Sonoma County Planning Commission:

Concerned Citizens for Estero Americano continues to object to the "K-2" "access point" shown on the revised draft public access LCP map. K-2 is not a public access point. As the public access appendix makes clear, K-2 is merely a "proposed" public access point. As my previous letters made clear, and as staff now seem to accept, significant legal obstacles prevent K-2 from likely ever being an actual public access point: Estero Lane is a private road, not a public access road, and public access to K-2 likely can never be consistent with the ESHA policies of the Coastal Act. Depicting K-2 as an "access point" on the public access map, when K-2 is not currently a public access point, has the potential to create significant confusion and cause significant environmental harm by encouraging trespassing onto environmentally sensitive habitat areas to which there is currently no legal public access.

Staff's analysis of K-2 also relied on a 1999 ""Coastal Parcel Study" by Sonoma Land Trust. On 25 June, I requested a copy of that report from Sonoma County staff, but I received no response. Until the public and the Planning Commission can review and meaningfully evaluate the materials that staff has cited and is relying on, I object to the Planning Commission making any decisions about the proposed LCP update now. The Planning Commission should continue this item to a subsequent meeting after the public has had a meaningful opportunity to review the voluminous materials staff has cited.
