RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS; COUNTY OF SONOMA, STATE OF CALIFORNIA, DENYING THE APPEAL OF CERTAIN CONDITIONS AND ADOPTING THE NEGATIVE DECLARAYION ANL APPROVING THE TENTATIVE MAP SUBJECTTO MODIFIED CONDITICHS.

WHERES , the applicant, Merton Smith, et al, filed a tentative'map with the Sonoma County Fermit and Resource Management Department for the Two Rock Estates Subdivision ocated at 1656 Middie Two Rnck Road, Petaluma, APIN 021-060-021, Zoned: AR (Agniculture and Residentiel), B6/3 acre density; Supervisorial District No. 2; and

WHEREAS, a Negative Declaration was prepared and posted for the proposed project in accordance with the appropriate law and guidelines; and

WHEREAS, said tentative map has been referred to the Project Review and Advisory Comminiee and interested ager.cies, and reports and recommendations have been received ther ifom; and

WHEREAS, in accurdance with the provisions of law, the Platining commission heid a peulic hearing on Januäry 4, 1996, at which time ell interested persons were given an opportunity to be heard; and

WHEREAS, the apeplicant; Merinn Smith oppealed the Planning Commission's de eis:on to the Board of Supervisors; and

WHEREAS, the Eoard of Supervisors conducter a duly noticed public hearing on March 19, 1996, at which time all interested persons were given an opportinity to be heard; and

WifEREAS, said tentative map is found to be in suifstantial coriformance with the provisions of the State Subdivision Map Act and Chapter 25 of the Sonoma County Code; and

WHEREAS, all $\sigma^{r}$ the firdings pursuant to Sections 66473.5 and 66474 of the Subdivision Map Act are fourd to be complied with; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Supervisors finds and determines that the project, as described, will have no substantial adverse effect on the erivironment based upon information contained in the Initial Study; and

WHEREAS. said Board of Supervisors makes the following findings:

1. The proposed tentative rnap is consistent with the General Plan and the West Petaiuma Area Plan.
2. The site i ${ }^{\mu}$, ysically suitable for the propnsed devtiopment.
3. The conditions of the tentative map sufficiently address the potenilal adverse impacts. Conutitions thiclude a 24 foot height limit on Lot 5 and a requirement that residential construction shall be restricted io building enveiopes to minimize potential visual impects.

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4. The tentative map complies with all the findings pursuant to Sections 66473.5 and 66474 of the Map Act.
5. As a result of the Initial Study, this project invoives no potential for adverse effect, either individually of cumulatively on wildlife resources.

NOW THEREFCRE BE IT RESOLVED that tie Board of Supervisors adypts the Negative Declaration as being completed in crimpliance with CEQA State and County guifelines and certifies that jt has reviewed and considered the information contained therein.

RE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Board of Supervisors denies the appeal and apprives the requested tentative map to subdivide $29.8+1$ - acres into nine (9) lots as conditioned.
